

Shiloh University currently accepts test-out credit, otherwise known as examination credit, awarded through the following programs:

- College-Level Examination Program (CLEP),
- Advanced Placement Program (AP), and
- Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support's (DANTES) Subject Standardized Tests Program (DSST)

For Associate of Arts students, up to 15 units of test-out credit may be awarded.

For Bachelor of Arts students, up to 30 units of test-out credit may be awarded.

For tests accepted from each testing program and required minimum scores, see charts (1-3) below.

For the maximum number of units that can be accepted within each category, refer to the General Education requirements for each program.

Depending on the program, credit earned above the maximum for a General Education category may be applied toward elective credit.

This reference chart does not supersede other stated Shiloh University transfer credit policies. All transfer credit must still be submitted and reviewed according to University guidelines.
